About the Role

An exciting opportunity to work in our bear sanctuaries in Chengdu, China. This position reports directly to our Founder & CEO, Jill Robinson. You will be overseeing and managing a team of animal behaviour and veterinary experts along with over 80+ animal care takers at our China Bear Rescue Centre (CBRC).

The Bear and Vet Team Director, China assumes responsibility for all activities, functions, and policies related to the department, including the department's budget and staff. Working closely with the CEO & Founder, Founding Director and China Director, the position provides strategic direction for the department, consistent with Animals Asia's overall vision, mission and policies.

*This is a human management role, and the candidate will not be working as a practicing veterinarian.

The ideal candidate:

- Very strong management skillset and ability to inspire and build capacity within a team.
- Understanding of working abroad and managing a team from diverse backgrounds and cultures.
- Passion for animal welfare.
- Can handle regular out of hours work.
- Can live with colleagues at the sanctuary.

- Chance to manage a team of Chinese and expatriate staff to improve the welfare of bears, cats and dogs that reside in the sanctuary.
- Opportunity to rescue and rehabilitate bears.

Location: China Bear Rescue Centre (CBRC) in Xindu District, LongQiao, Chengdu, China

Job Responsibilities

- Oversee and manage the Bear & Vet Team at CBRC and off site, including budget, HR, purchase, evaluations, training and development, and ensure all relevant behavioural enrichment practices, protocols and procedures are functional and strictly adhered to in order to facilitate the care of the bears and other animals both at CBRC and off site.
- Review and refine policies and procedures associated with the sanctuary and care of bears.\
- Liaise with the wider management team, such as the Vietnam Bear Rescue Centre, fundraising, communication teams, and construction department, to ensure the smooth running of CBRC
- Making sure all staff adhere to established Health & Safety policies and procedures, oversee any onsite emergencies and develop and maintain effective working relationships in regard to work procedures, employee relations and procurement related concerns.
- Coordinate bear rescues in conjunction with the China Director, Founding Director & CEO.
- Ensure that inter-department and inter-personal relationships at CBRC are positive, cohesive, and contribute to the overall mission of Animals Asia.

Job Requirements

- Strong people management and leadership skills and the ability to motivate and inspire staff.
- Staff training and development experience.
- Technical expertise in bear behaviour, animal welfare, animal husbandry and/or veterinary medicine.
- At least 5 years working in an animal sanctuary, wildlife rescue centre, wildlife rehabilitation centre, zoological park, or veterinary hospital.
- Bachelor's degree in biology, zoology, conservation, animal welfare or behaviour, or veterinary science.
- Capable of dealing with and handling emergency situations.
- Good teamwork and communication skills.
- Proficiency in spoken and written English.
- NGO work experience is preferred.
- Suitable candidates must be able to commit for a minimum of 2 years.

Appointment is paid, full-time, five (5) days a week with some weekend work applicable.
